Spring Blooms are Blossoming at Cincinnati Nature Center

As winter fades away and spring brings an awakening of dormant plants and animals, the scenery turns from gray to green. At Cincinnati Nature Center, thousands of daffodils are blooming, creating rivers of yellow.

Many yards have sprouting daffodils this time of year, but none with such a legacy as those at the Cincinnati Nature Center. The blooms that spread across CNC's acres of land were originally planted nearly a hundred years ago by Carl Krippendorf. The daffodil was Carl's favorite flower and it thrived in Cincinnati's soil and climate.

Each year, Carl and his staff made sure the daffodil bulbs had room to grow; carefully, they separated the bulblets to prevent overcrowding. Today, thanks to Carl Krippendorf's hard work and love of flowers, daffodils greet Cincinnati Nature Center's visitors at the entrance and spread all the way out to the forests.

To see even more colorful blooms, hikers can explore the Wildflower Trail and learn about the variety of native and non-native species growing on this land. Naturalist-guided hikes are available on April 5, April 18 and May 16. The self-guided wildflower folklore trail brochure is available daily in the Rowe Visitor Center.

Cincinnati Nature Center is open seven days a week. Admission is \$3 for adults and \$1 for children on weekdays and \$5 for adults and \$1 for children on weekends. Mondays are free for individuals and families.
